



OVERVIEW

- > Panguna's redevelopment an economic priority
- > BCL set to be majority-owned Bougainvillean company
- > Strong Bougainvillean board representation
- > Long-term prospects dependent on project tenure
- ➤ Judicial Review of EL1 adjourned until 10/7/2023
- > BCL enjoys good relations with stakeholders
- > Community support program remains important focus
- > ABG and PNG government continue referendum negotiations



FINANCIAL RESULTS

- > Loss of K6.9 million compared to K6.1 million previous year
- > Total consolidated net assets of K98 million
- Expenditure concentrated on tenure issues and community engagement
- Company remains debt free
- No dividend will be paid



LIQUID ASSETS

- > Financial assets include cash and equities
- > Income from interest and dividends K4.0 million
- ➤ Fair value of company investments decreased K22.7 million amid volatility in global share markets
- > Realised gains on sale of investments K3.9 million
- > Equities only sold to help fund company operations

ENVIRONMENTAL AND SOCIAL ISSUES

- Panguna Mine Legacy ImpactAssessment progressing
- ➤ Work expected to take 18 months
- Predominantly funded by Rio Tinto with some support from BCL
- BCL oversight committee member
- Company has contributed baseline information

- Company adheres to various charters and policies (available on web site)

- Sponsored training in pig husbandry, poultry and vanilla farming
